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1. Preliminary information

This Call for Applications is addressed to non-EU applicants with a foreign study qualification who are residing abroad and are applying for a Visa at the Italian Embassy/Consulate.

Admission to the Master's Degree in **PHYSICS- FISICA (LM-17)** is subject to an online application for evaluation of the academic background to be submitted by each applicant; the assessment interview will take place by **June 30 2026**, as based on the procedure described in the present Call for Application.

Enrolment must be completed no later than **22 December 2026**.

Italian applicants, EU applicants (regardless of their residence), and foreign applicants who are legally residing in Italy, in possess of a foreign study qualification eligible for the enrolment in the Master's Degree Programme in **PHYSICS- FISICA (LM-17)**, shall follow the procedure described in the call for applications specifically issued for them, which will be published in May 2026 indicatively on the website <https://www.unimore.it/it/ateneo/bandi>

2. Qualifications and knowledge required

Applicants are required to possess:

- a. Bachelor's degree deemed suitable and awarded or to be awarded before March 6, 2026.
- b. Level B2 (Common European Framework of Reference) language certificate, or alternatively a declaration by the university (Language Centre or Department) in which the applicant is enrolled confirming the required skill level.

- University English exams providing B2 level, with a declaration issued by the home University as documental evidence;
- Bachelor degree in English;
- English mother-tongue countries of origin (foreign or Italian citizens who are fluent in their language of origin as a consequence of their family or language experience shall be considered of foreign mother tongue);

For potential future students without suitable documentation for certifying their level of knowledge upon entry, the Language Center of the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia offers the possibility of taking a B2 level test remotely. Enrolment in the English test is subject to the application for the degree course of interest. Candidates will therefore be able to register for an English test only after having applied for the degree course of their choice. The requirements and the knowledge will be verified by assessing the university career and possibly holding an interview. Applicants are required to submit an online application in order to be assessed.

3. Assessment of the academic background

A dedicated Board will assess the student's background knowledge.

Required academic knowledge is as follows:

- General knowledge of basic mathematics and numerical calculation (mathematical analysis; numerical analysis; geometry) and basic chemistry.
- General knowledge of basic physics (classic physics; mechanics, thermodynamics and fluid physics; electromagnetism; laboratory of classic physics; techniques for data acquisition and statistical processing of experimental data).
- General knowledge of theoretical physics and mathematical physics (mathematical methods for physics; analytic mechanics; introduction to quantum physics).
- General knowledge of matter physics (introduction to matter structure).
- Good knowledge of the English language, both written and oral. The level of knowledge of the English language will be assessed by means of an interview. On the basis of the submitted documentation, the examination board decides whether an additional interview is required or not for English native speakers.

Such knowledge will be verified by assessing the university career; an interview may also be necessary.

Based on specific procedures provided in the Educational Regulation of the Master's Degree Programme in **PHYSICS- FISICA (LM-17)**, if the study programme is not perfectly consistent with the requirements, the Board will evaluate the need to integrate the curriculum with an extra programme borne by the student to be successfully completed by June 30, 2026.

4. Submitting an online application for evaluation

To submit their application, students must:

- register on the website www.esse3.unimore.it to get the username and password required for access to the Restricted Area. Please check that the e-mail address provided is correct in order to receive any future communications

- after logging in, choose Registered/Student Area from the menu tab and enter the reserved area, then choose "Application for evaluation".

- after choosing PHYSICS- FISICA (LM-17) selection, answer 'Yes' to question: "Are you an International student with a foreign degree, residing abroad, applying for a visa through the Italian Embassy/Consulate?" then fill in the online application and attach the documents listed below:

1. Certificate of the study qualification obtained and the degree mark. Students who have not yet obtained the qualification must state the expected awarding date;
2. List of the examinations passed reporting the date, the score obtained and the duration of

the teaching programme;

3. List of any examinations still to be taken;
4. Certificate reporting the maximum degree score assigned by the foreign University awarding the qualification;
5. Detailed programme of the exams: for each teaching, indicate the topics studied and further examined;
6. Other skills acquired and useful for the assessment (e.g. IT skills, language skills, work experience, etc.).

IMPORTANT: the application is correctly submitted only after saving the data and answering YES to the question "Do you want to submit your application now?"

In order for the application to be taken into consideration, all candidates must pay a non-refundable processing fee of €20.00.

Payment must be made BY 06/03/2026.

As indicated in the information notice available at:

<https://www.unimore.it/it/didattica/immatricolazioni-e-iscrizioni/pagamenti>, the payment procedure requires logging into www.esse3.unimore.it, selecting the "Tasse" (Fees) section to view the amounts due, and accessing the PagoPA system.

The required fees must be paid exclusively through the PagoPA system, which allows online payment by selecting one's Payment Service Provider (PSP). A confirmation email will be sent to the personal email address provided during registration, or to the University email account if already activated. From the personal Esse3 page, under the "Tasse" (Fees) section, it will be possible to download the payment receipt.

Please pay close attention to the deadlines.

5. Amending or reopening an online application for evaluation

Should the applicant need to reopen the application and correct the data or add extra documents before the deadline of March 6 2026, please send an e-mail to the Registrar's Office segrstud.scienze.fisiche.informatiche.matematiche@unimore.it.

6. Assessment Results

The Examination Board, appointed by the Department of Physical, Computer and Mathematical Sciences evaluates the qualifications and the documental evidence provided.

Applications will be evaluated based on the order of submission.

An individual interview will follow the verification of curricular requirements, aimed at checking the academic background and motivation of the applicant to undertake the Master's Degree Programme. The interview will be held in English and by means of electronic systems (GMeet) if needed.

The results of the assessment will be made available to students at <https://siaweb.unimore.it/public/valutazionilm/EsitiE.aspx?aaid=2026&testid=3&en=1> and also sent via e-mail to the address indicated during registration.

The above-mentioned page will show one of the following results:

- **PASS:** the student's academic background is deemed suitable and the applicant may complete the final enrolment in the programme by following the instructions outlined in 7.
- **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:** after considering the admission requirements and the suitable initial preparation, the Board will indicate any additional credit requirements and the means to comply with them. Any educational debt shall be complied with before the enrolment and in any case by 31 July 2026 to ensure that the applicant has enough time to enrol by 22 December 2026.
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- **FAIL:** in this case the examination board will state the reasons for evaluating the student's academic background as not suitable. The applicant will not be allowed to enrol.

The following may also appear:

- - **NOT FINAL APPLICATION:** if the student has not explicitly confirmed the application by answering YES in the specific field “Do you want to submit your application now?”, hence the application cannot be assessed.
- - **FOR ASSESSMENT:** the application has been submitted by the applicant, but the examination Board has not yet assessed the application

7. Enrolment procedure (degree programme)

Foreign citizens residing abroad and applying for a visa must follow the provisions and deadlines relating to academic year 2026-2027 indicated in the circular of the Ministry of University and Research on <https://www.studiare-in-italia.it/studenti-stranieri/> relating to access to study programmes. They must also comply with the annual definition of the quota reserved for them, approved by the University.

For the Academic Year 2026/2027 the quota is of no. 25 places reserved to non-EU students applying for a visa.

7.1 Pre-enrolment on Universitaly for the purpose of obtaining a student visa

As indicated in the ministerial circular for access to study programmes, Non-EU applicants residing abroad and requesting a visa must pre-enrol on the UNIVERSITALY website by clicking on the link

<https://universitaly-private.cineca.it/index.php/login> .

The pre-enrolment application is automatically sent to UNIMORE for validation. UNIMORE will notify the Italian Consular Authority in the event of admission to the study programme.

Applicants have to upload the following documents on the Universitaly website:

- their passport
- a passport photo

Any further documents relating to their academic qualification may also be attached, including:

- Original title of study certificate and its translation
- declaration of value, issued by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the country to which the school issuing the qualification belongs
 - or, alternatively
- statements issued by ENIC-NARIC centres such as the comparability certificate issued by the *Centro di informazione sulla mobilità e le Equivalenze accademiche* (CIMEA) - website <https://www.cimea.it/EN/> For further information, visit the website <https://www.cimea.it/EN/pagina-attestati-di-comparabilita-e-verifica-dei-titoli>

Please contact the reference Embassy/Consulate as soon as possible to check the requirements and the documents needed for the visa to be issued.

7.2 Enrolment

Enrolment to the Master's Degree Programme in Physics (class LM-17) is reserved to "suitable applicants", i.e. those meeting the following requirements:

- have completed the pre-enrolment procedure on the Universitaly website
- obtain a student visa for Italy in time for the enrolment.

Enrolment: **8 July to 22 December 2026.**

The following documents must be submitted to the Registrar's Office for enrolment:

1. Bachelor degree diploma, translated and legalised by the Italian Embassy/Consulate Declaration of value of the university degree, issued by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the country to which the school issuing the qualification belongs or alternatively a declaration by ENIC-NARIC

2. Degree certificate, issued by the University awarding the degree
3. copy of the residence permit or alternatively a copy of the post office receipt, certifying the filing of the residence permit request.
4. valid ID
5. passport photo.

Once the Registrar's Office has verified the correctness and completeness of the documentation submitted by the student, it will make the contribution slips for the 2026-2027 academic year available on the personal page in Esse3, under the heading "Fees", and finalise enrolment after payment of the first instalment.

IMPORTANT

Please note that the payment date indicated on the ELECTRONIC PAYMENT RECEIPT applies. Regardless of the justifications provided, payments reporting a date later than 22 December 2026 on the receipt will not be deemed valid for enrolment purposes.

PLEASE NOTE According to AgID (Agency for Digital Italy), the payment may be made by the payment service provider on the day following the payer's request. This would preclude the enrolment.

8. Means of payment

As indicated on the information notice published on <https://www.unimore.it/en/PagoPA>, login to www.esse3.unimore.it and go to the *Tax* section to view the amounts due and access the pagoPA system for payment. The amounts due shall be paid only through the PagoPA system, which allows for:

- a. **A) online payments** (choosing your Payment Service Provider - **PSP**). A payment confirmation email will be sent to the address provided by the applicant upon registration to the website, or to the relevant University email address, if any. Applicants will be able to print the payment receipt from their reserved area in Esse3 under the *Tax* section.

or, alternatively

- a. **B) printing the payment notice** and paying the amount through Banks, ATM counters, or SISAL, Lottomatica and ITB sales points, namely payment service providers for the PagoPA system that will issue a receipt of the payment request.

Please note that charges due may vary based on the chosen PSP.

10. Costs and allowances

The non-UE citizenship student, whose family unit exhibits income/estate abroad only, can benefit from a fixed subsidized rate contribution system (FLAT TAX EXTRA UE) on the basis of an economic condition evaluated by the University by means of an income, assessed with reference to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), in Purchasing Power Parity (PPP), established for every country of origin and annually updated with data by the World Bank.

The University will organize for all students, who have uploaded their application on the Universitaly platform, educational meetings focused on this topic. The calendar of meetings will be published at the website: <https://www.unimore.it/en/prospective-students>

In order to apply for benefits (e.g. exemption from university fees, scholarship, accommodation in university residences, catering services, and other benefits) international students residing abroad must submit an online application by the end of August 2026. Online applications need to be submitted on the website www.er-go.it even before the enrolment or the assessment result or the visa release.

The Call for Benefit Applications, together with all the rules constituting its special law, will be published approximately at the beginning of July 2026.

Students are invited to check the deadlines. For further information and to check any possible update on the Academic Year 2026-2027, please refer to the website www.unimore.it/ammissione/tasse.html.

Failure to submit the online application will result in the payment of the total amount of university fees of approximately 2,200.00 EUR, divided into 4 instalments.

The above provided information is up-to-date as of December 2026; they may be subject to updates/changes/integration based on the Decisions of the University Bodies, made after this call is published but which will be published and made known on the website.

Students with a disability, willing to present a document issued by a public authority, in which a disability is certified, must proceed with the sworn translation into Italian of this document and upload it to the portal www.esse3.unimore.it during the submitting procedure of the ADMISSION APPLICATION.
